PRESIDENT'S LETTER

Looking Ahead

Since 1998, the Alumni Association has been led by presidents and vice presidents largely from the classes of the 1950s and 1960s. The board has managed an ongoing balance of members from all decades (save 2010-'19), including one apiece from the Class of 2024 and the Class of 2026. In my 13 years as president, I have often said my mission was to turn a 20th-century organization into a 21st-century organization, changing several bylaw definitions along the way. One change increased the size of the board; another created the position of vice president of communication; another opened the newsletter to all alumni, not just members and made it available online.

Now I heartily encourage the board to look ahead, prioritizing member recruitment and younger leadership. I nominate a Leadership/Nominating Committee of Mary Todd, '95; Shane Armstrong, '98, co-chair; Ryan Erbe, '99; Erica Brazee, '00; Bryan Innes, '01; Brian Rothenberg, '02, co-chair; Justin Poss, '06; and Megan Lewis, '24 to immediately take on the challenge of choosing a new president and evaluating board and officer development.

Looking Back with Pride

As I work through my 25th year on the Alumni Association Board and my 13th as president, I am proud to reflect on the impact of SCSAA. We've become a continually active, significant and well-loved local institution, providing service, support, and leadership in the process of fulfilling our mission: "To serve alumni, school and community."

I'm proud to have led the transformation of Reflections from a twice-yearly, members-only newsprint edition to a quarterly, full-color newsletter available online and by mail. We've expanded from awarding five annual scholarships to eight, then 10, and, this year, we will add 10 more. Together with Steve Anderson, Dane Woytek and Shane Armstrong, SCSAA was fundamental in conceptualizing and executing the Veterans Memorial Park, a project for which SCSAA garnered more than \$40,000 in alumni support. This year marks the park's 10th anniversary. SCSAA has also given matching grants in support of the Sidney Memorial Public Library, the Sidney Center Improvement Group, the Southern Tier Music Festival, and several Main Street projects.

The association continues to fund five SSADD students' attendance of Teen Institute and sends four students to the FFA Annual Leadership Conference. We present Career Day annually for Sidney Students in grades 7-12 and occasional workshops to student-leaders in public speaking and Robert's Rules of Order. In 2019, we added students to our association by creating an Alumni Association Leadership program, which maintains four to six students each year from grades 9-12 who work with our 22-member board of directors at all meetings and projects.

Our annual Wall of Fame Induction and Sports Hall of Fame Induction have become social-community highlight events honoring alumni, educators, and coaches.

Thanks to the All-Class Luncheon founders Blanche Hunter, Velma Riggs, Betty Rowe, Donald Laraway, Bernadine Boardman, Sally Provenzon, and our founding member and President Emeritus Terry Dermody, the Sidney Central School Alumni Association is the only known high school alumni group in the country that presents an annual all-class reunion three-day weekend, with activities throughout the town; scheduled sports, awards, and social events; and an all-alumni march on Main Street.

The association's success in fulfilling its mission and living daily in the "Spirit of Sidney" has encouraged alumni to donate and bequeath, such that SCSAA, while operating on membership funds and event income, is able to develop an endowment fund, ensuring association's vibrant future. I am grateful for having had the opportunity to contribute and to lead.

Sidney CSD Highlights

Justin Poss, '06, is the school board liaison to SCSAA. He reports the following items as March highlights:

Twenty seniors are on track to earn the Seal of Civic Readiness, for which they must complete projects tied to real issues, including mental health, substance abuse, and rural community challenges.

More than 40 juniors attended the SUNY Broome College Fair. This served as early exposure to universities and colleges, majors, and possible next steps after graduation.

The Sidney CSD's Afterschool Program continues to grow. There are about 150 students participating, with consistent staff support. Students get to swim and participate in a cooking class as part of this program.

The district is working through an updated technology plan; it will focus on AI use in schools and improving student access.

Sidney will host leaders from the NYS Rural School Association in May to showcase what a small district is doing well.

College Signing Day is scheduled for June 2, to recognize student-athletes continuing at the next level.

Tom Price, '65



Tom stands as a shining example of what it means to be a well-rounded scholar-athlete. Excelling in three sports, he distinguished himself most notably on the football field, where his extraordinary talent and relentless drive earned him all-league honors and an impressive average of more than five yards per carry. His eight varsity letters reflect not just athletic talent, but consistent excellence and unwavering dedication.

Tom's leadership extended beyond the playing field. As a participant in the Varsity Club, Student Council, and Booster Club, he brought the same commitment and integrity to his service as he did to competition, culminating in his election as class vice president and president. His ability to inspire teammates and classmates alike set him apart as a natural leader.

Tom's achievements did not go unnoticed. His hard work and determination earned him a full football scholarship at Syracuse University, where he continued to pursue excellence and opened the door to a promising future in athletics. Following his playing days, Tom's passion for the game endured and he spent years officiating basketball at various levels, giving back to the sports community that shaped him.

Jim Wilson, '71



Jim was a three-sport athlete: cross country, baseball, and wrestling. Jim's passion was especially dedicated to wrestling, starting on varsity as a freshman in 1968, up through his senior year. In the '60s, Sidney became a wrestling powerhouse, so starting as a freshman in 1968 is an impressive achievement. Jim was following his brother, Dale, who wrestled on the '65 and '67 teams. He was Section IV Champion twice, Windsor Christmas Tournament champion twice, and Sus League champion three times during what is considered the golden era of Sidney wrestling.

Jim was involved in American Legion summer baseball and was a dedicated runner for the cross-country program that started in 1965. He earned two varsity baseball letters and contributed to one of the program's strongest cross-country teams in 1971.

After high school, Jim continued his love for sports by playing in local golf tournaments and spending summer days on the course. He also played for years in the local softball league, eventually switching to pitcher to extend his playing days. An avid fisherman, Jim enjoyed trips to upstate New York for the salmon run. Above all, he was a devoted supporter of his children's and grandchildren's athletic pursuits, frequently attending their games and meets, especially in Sidney.

Gerald Washington, '75

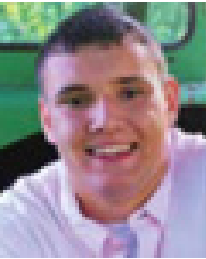


In 2025, Gerald was inducted into the Sidney Alumni Wall of Fame. His life story is not only interesting but also a model of achievement. Gerald credits his beloved mother for shaping his character and ambition, reflecting the profound influence she had on him throughout his formative years in Sidney and beyond.

Gerald was a two-time Sus League Football All-Star, leading the league in passing receptions for two consecutive years. Renowned as the best natural fighter Pat McElligott had ever seen, Gerald also excelled in track, mostly in the high jump.

His impact extended beyond competition; he earned high praise from colleagues as an exceptional coach and dedicated volunteer. In rodeo, Gerald competed in calf roping, team roping, bulldogging, and bull riding, winning more than 20 awards throughout his career.

Austin Dean, '15



Dean's story is one of determination, extraordinary talent, and an unwavering drive to succeed. A proud graduate of Sidney High School, Dean distinguished himself as one of the school's most accomplished athletes. Earning First-Team All-State honors on both offense and defense, he dominated the football field with a rare combination of skill, grit, and leadership.

Dean's athletic prowess went beyond the gridiron. As a two-time Section IV Class C wrestling champion and the 2015 State wrestling champion, he set a new standard for excellence in the wrestling ring. Dean also claimed the title of Section IV, Class "C" Champion in track (discus) and went on to become a MAC Champion in varsity track (discus) and wrestling. These remarkable achievements reflect his versatility, discipline, and relentless pursuit of greatness.

Behind Dean's many accomplishments is a supportive family: his parents, Corey and Donna Dean, and four siblings, Wade, Danielle, William, and Corey Jr., who have cheered him on every step of the way.

Now, as he seeks a degree in Criminal Justice, Dean continues to embody the values of hard work, ambition, and integrity, qualities that promise to serve him well in his future endeavors. Dean's legacy at Sidney is not just measured in titles and trophies, but in the inspiration he provides to all working to reach their fullest potential.

Coach & Educator Jeff Matthews



Coach Matthews has dedicated more than 30 years to coaching, shaping young athletes from Pee Wee through varsity. As head football coach at Sidney High School since 1996, he has compiled a 130-96 record and led the team to a NYSPHSAA State Championship in 2005. Under his leadership, Sidney has earned three Section IV titles and multiple league championships. Coach Matthews has been recognized as The Daily Star Coach of the Year eight times and is known for fostering a culture of "Pride in the Tribe."

A graduate of Elmira Southside High School (1984) and Cortland State (1990), he has demonstrated a commitment to excellence that has left a lasting impact on the Sidney football program and its community.

Quoting Greg Davie: "The 2005 State Championship team was the culmination of a ton of hard work and the nurturing of talent from the Pee Wee level through varsity. Warrior fans reveled in how well their boys played while the coaches and players fed off the high-energy support of the Sidney fans. Magical and memorable, this was truly the season for "Pride in the Tribe."

1966-'67 Wrestling Legacy Team

Greg Davie shared, "Regarding the first Legacy Award, presented in 2007, a lively discussion ensued about the best teams of all time across all sports."

In 2009, the first wrestling team from 1964-'65 was honored, and some members of tonight's team were there. Many consider the 1965, 1967, and 1968 teams the best in Sidney wrestling history.

Now, it's the 1967 team's turn to be recognized.

High school wrestling is one of the toughest sports, physically and mentally. Each wrestler pushes their limits, learns technique, stays within strict weight classes, and battles through tough matches. It takes discipline, resilience, and a strong work ethic.

National Hall of Fame coach Tom Robertson taught his wrestlers these values. He once said, "I never had to raise my voice to these kids."

The team faces just as many challenges. Wrestlers help each other through tough practices, celebrate wins, and learn from losses. Success comes from both individual effort and teamwork, encouragement, and a shared drive to get better.

High school wrestling builds character, friendships, and memories that last.

Back in the mid-1960s, there were fewer tournaments than today. Sidney always took part in the state's oldest and most prestigious event, the Windsor Christmas Tournament. With almost 20 teams from across the state, Sidney scored 80 points to win the championship.

Competing in the annual Sus League Tournament, seven of our 12 starting wrestlers made it to the finals. Randy Payne, a sophomore, along with seniors Rick Cole and Mark Payne, became champions.

The team also won the overall Section IV title. Sidney had three sectional champions, Randy Payne (103 lbs.), Ricky Cole (112 lbs.) and Mark Payne (138 lbs.).

Rick and Mark later became New York State Champions.

This team truly impressed everyone. Congratulations!

Longtime Coaches Inducted into Section IV Hall of Fame

On Saturday, April 25, two of Sidney's longtime coaches were inducted into the Section IV Hall of Fame. Mike Brazee and Jeff Matthews were physical education teachers and varsity coaches with many successful teams over their tenure.

Mike Brazee, '76, taught at Sidney for 30 years. His varsity coaching career began with boys' basketball in 1990. Throughout his 30-year tenure, Brazee's teams won seven division championships, one Susquenango League championship, four MAC League championships, and three Section IV championships. Additionally, his teams made three appearances in the NYS Final Four, winning two New York state Class C championships, in 1998 and 2007. Brazee had 426 wins in basketball. He was a four-time Daily Star Coach of the Year, and was named Basketball Coaches Association of NY Section IV Coach of the Year twice.

In 2000, he picked up a second varsity sport, softball, which he coached for 21 years. In 2013, he also began coaching varsity golf. His golf teams won three consecutive MAC League championships, in 2013-14, 2014-15, and 2015-16. Notably, in 2014-15, all three of Brazee's varsity teams - golf, basketball, and softball - won the MAC championship.

Jeff Matthews was an educator and coach for 28 years. In 1996, he became Sidney's varsity football head coach. Matthews' football teams had a 136-116 record, and averaged more than 27 points per game. His teams won two division championships, three sectional titles and a New York state Class C championship in 2005. That season, the Warriors outscored their opponents 578-222. His teams also won three Section IV titles and three regional titles. From 2005- 2006, Matthews' teams had an 18-game winning streak.

Matthews also spent 17 years as an assistant varsity track and field coach. In his role as throwing coach, he helped 13 athletes qualify for states in 26 throwing events.



Senior Leadership Fellows



SCSAA's Leadership Fellows program is open to Sidney students in grades 9-12. Interested students apply and are interviewed by SCSAA board members. Selected students serve on SCSAA's board, help run events at Alumni Weekend, keep the board informed of school happenings, and more. This year, two Leadership Fellows, Abby Boyce and Cooper Harvey, are graduating. Both have been with SCSAA since their sophomore year.

Abby Boyce has been a Leadership Fellow for three years, and has been on the social media committee for two. Abby is also president of the Sidney Students Against Destructive Decisions club, secretary for the Class of 2026, and a member of Science Olympiad, Honor Society, and the Chamber Choir. Outside of school, Abby is a dedicated crew member and earned the Eagle Scout rank in October through the Scouting America Program.

After high school, Abby plans to attend SUNY Broome to obtain an associate's degree in business administration, while also working toward her Emergency Medical Technician certification through Otsego County, pursuing a career as a paramedic.

Abby is grateful for the opportunities found through her time working with SCSAA. Abby said her favorite part of being a Leadership Fellow is helping during Alumni Weekend, where she saw the beauty of community and the importance of staying connected to your roots.

Cooper Harvey began working with SCSAA as a photographer for the Sports Hall of Fame banquet and Alumni Weekend events before taking an official position as a Leadership Fellow. Now in his third year as a Leadership Fellow, Cooper is on the social media committee and recently began working on the SCSAA website. In school, Cooper is vice president of FFA and treasurer of Yearbook Club. Outside of school, Cooper serves on the board of directors for the Delaware County Youth Bureau and runs his own photography business.

Following graduation, Cooper plans to attend SUNY Broome online for computer security and forensics, then transfer to a four-year university to focus on cybersecurity and computer engineering.

Cooper looks forward to continuing his time on the board, when he becomes our newest director after graduating. He said his favorite part of being a Leadership Fellow is making connections in the community and helping with initiatives.
